

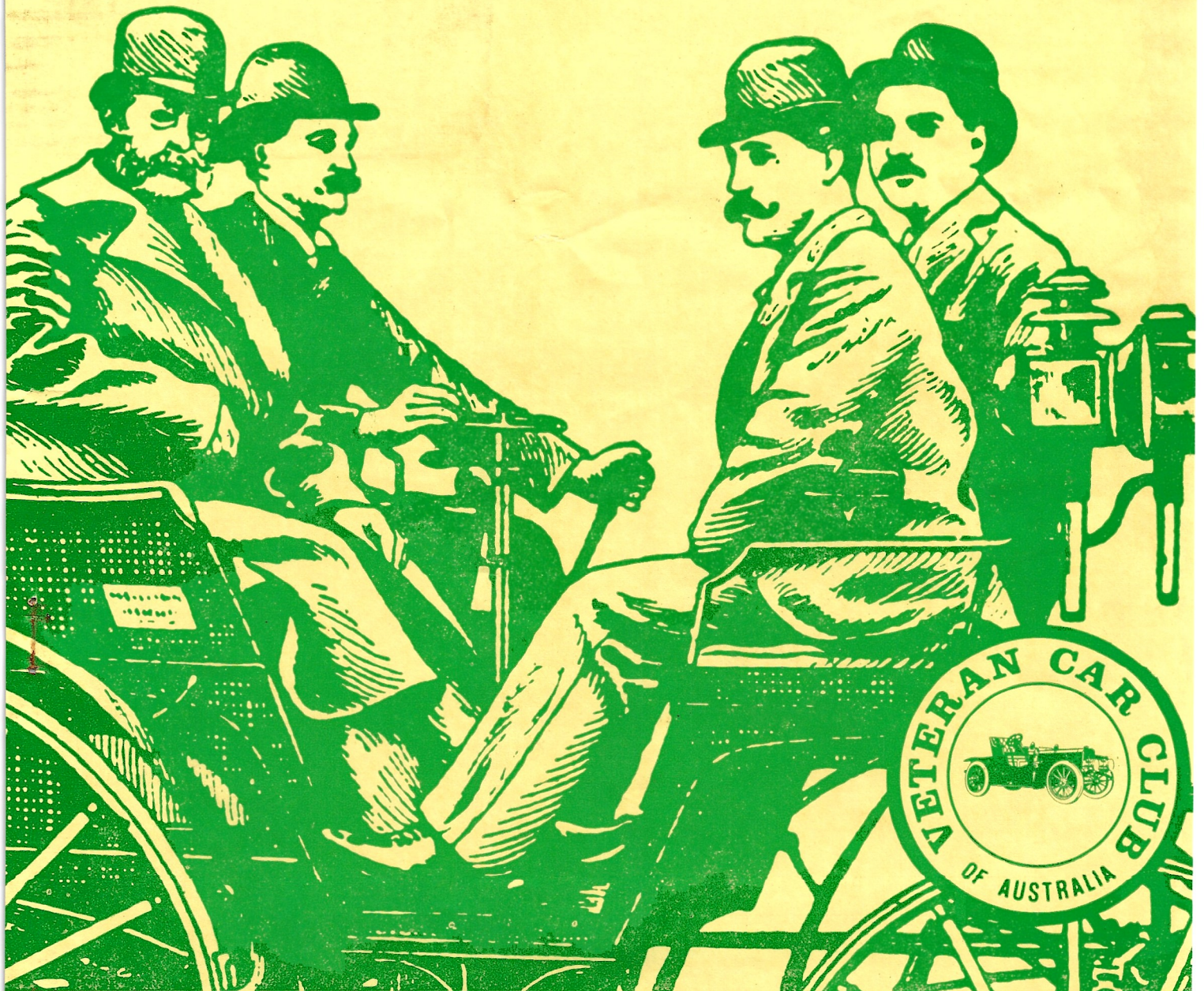

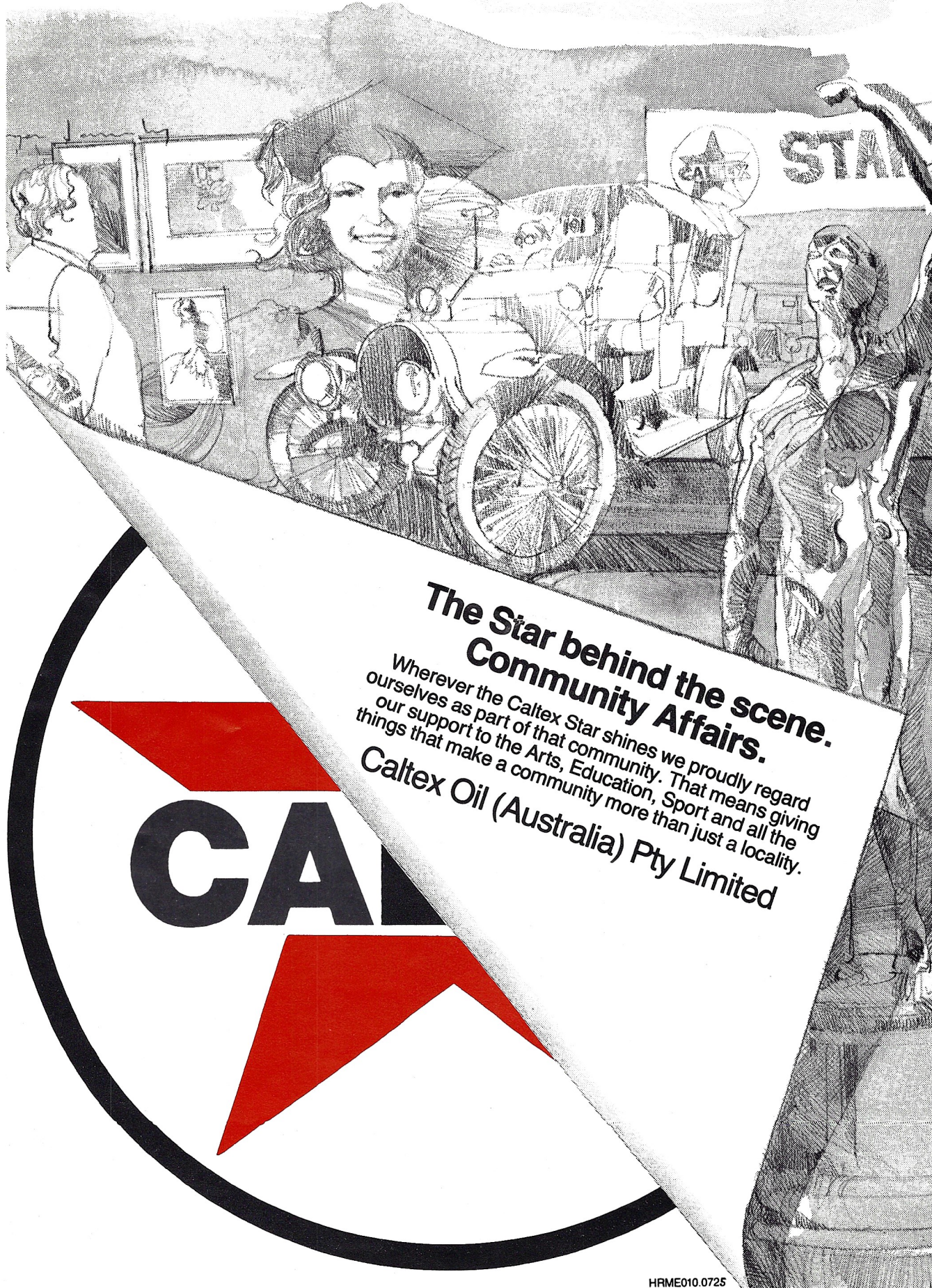

THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE1980 Newcastle Annual Tour

If one looks at a visitor's guide of the Newcastle area under the heading of "The City of Enterprise", one is introduced to its beaches, its scenic Memorial Drive, the views from its vantage points, its proximity to Lake Macquarie or Port Stephens and the sport and relaxation each have to offer, or perhaps it is an interest in the liquid gold of the wine-growing district of the Hunter Valley that attracts the visitor or even the city itself, but when one's interest is veteran motoring and despite at times bumper-to-bumper highway conditions caused by the exodus of people on the long weekend to their favourite holiday resorts, our Newcastle compatriots were able to arrange a tour through a quiet, peaceful and scenic countryside (marred only by the drought) on roads virtually devoid of traffic.

Centred on Morpeth, its many old buildings "some dating back 130 years", spacious grounds and excellent meals, "breakfast through to supper", at a very reasonable cost, entertainment on the Saturday night was a gas-light parade.

Our tour commenced on the Sunday morning from within the grounds and proceeded to Seham Weir picnic grounds, 23.1 miles, for morning tea and a driving test, through Clarencetown and north to Dungog, a further 28.4 miles to lunch and a second driving test and return to Morpeth, via Paterson, a total of 86.7 miles.

I believe all were encouraged by the roll-up of twenty-two veteran cars, ranging in age from 1906 to 1918 and despite congested highway conditions, ten entrants either drove or trailed their vehicles from Sydney.

One had only to talk with the organisers, especially John Gorton and George Adams, to sense the appreciation they felt for the support received.

Both Pam and I were more than pleased to have made the effort, at the informality of the event and by the sense of fellowship that prevailed. We look forward to again being entertained under similar conditions and surroundings and hope that these words will encourage other members to do likewise.

On a more personal note, it was gratifying to see Sandy Holmes out and about, complete with camera, smiling and ably assisted by Peggy, while on our return to Sydney we detoured to the western-side of Lake Macquarie to Balmoral, to visit Len and Jean Masser. Len is his usual sparkling self, but Jean is far from well, although cheerful. Pam and I were very pleased to see them and they us.

### MORE MONEY

Last month in this section of the magazine I spoke of the club's future plans and a heavy requirement for money for us to achieve the goal of having new club premises.

While I am in favour of a Federal magazine I do not agree that two states should be burdened with the load of providing the necessary funds, especially in our case as we had budgeted for a possible \$500.00 sponsorship support then found we need to obtain \$1,000.00 plus the additional \$75.00 for capitation fees putting us that little bit further behind.
