Old Hume Highway Historic Houses Tour. November 18th-19th 2017 National Trust (NSW) / Paul Butler Bequest

Bringing together historic properties and heritage cars is not a new idea as many of us have enjoyed displaying our heritage cars in the grounds of some of Australia's most historically significant buildings. But to make it a dedicated Tour for more than 45 pre-1931 cars to three important National Trust properties, add a scenic bit of the Old Hume Highway, some quiet country localities with their own heritage charm, great company and heritage house tours and meals all supported by sponsorship from the National Trust (NSW) then you have the Old Hume Highway Historic Houses Tour 2017.

Wilga and Euan Coutts (Veteran Car Club, VSCC and National Trust members) organised the event, bringing their considerable veteran and vintage rallying experiences to ensuring the best possible Tour for entrants, families and guests, *and* the cars. The cooperation of the National Trust, its local volunteers and sponsorship from the Butler Estate Motor Vehicle Fund guaranteed that the Tour was going to be a special weekend combining heritage houses and heritage vehicles.

A little bit of history first. If you were in the Sydney veteran and vintage world in the 1980s you'll probably remember Paul Butler, a collector of not just cars but car parts, antique typewriters, gramophones, signs, locks, telephones, sewing machines, petrol pumps, bicycles, radios and more. His extensive collection of things mechanical was stored at his homes in Darley Road, Randwick where he built a large shed with the intention of opening a museum. A member of the Austin 7 Club, Veteran Car Club and the Sunbeam Talbot Darracq Register, Paul's eclectic taste in vehicles meant he wasn't restricted to just those clubs though, I first met him at the Vintage Motor Club when he accompanied fellow Sunbeam enthusiast Andy Douglas. I well recall too Paul picking over my trailer of vintage parts at Chatswood Swap Meets.

Paul died suddenly in June 1991, at the time he owned fifteen historic cars, two historic trucks and two vintage motorcycles, all but four were in an incomplete state of repair. The major beneficiary of his Will was the National Trust (NSW) who established the Butler Estate Fund in May 2009 to be used for the promotion and preservation of veteran and vintage cars within New South Wales, hence the Tour.

The Tour. I think Paul Butler would have approved of this event just for veteran and vintage vehicles, old-style car club motoring on quiet roads, some that many entrants admitted they had never ventured on before

Tour entrants came from several clubs – VSCC, VCCA, VMC, Orange District AMC, Parkes AMC, VVCA, RROCA, Alvis CC, Austin 7 Register and Riley Motor Club.

VCCA participants were – Peter, Regina, Georgia and James Weir -1908 Vauxhall; Kevin and Narelle Spackman - 1911 Ford; Mathew Spackman - 1913 Ford; Geoff and Louise Yoemans - 1914 Wolseley; John and Susan Wards - 1914 Benz; David, Martine and Betty Cherry - 1916 Chevrolet; Doug and Vivian Fulford – 1929 Studebaker; John and Jan Grant – 1929 Studebaker and Jenny Fawbert – 1928 Oldsmobile.

The Tour started at the magnificent Retford Park, Bowral, a country home built 1887 in the Italianate-style for the Hordern family and last year gifted to the National Trust by James Fairfax AC. On arrival a scrumptious morning tea could be enjoyed while waiting for house tours or for the cars to make their way around the red gravel drive among beautiful gardens to be professionally photographed under the elaborate porte-cochere (*carriage porch*). The weather was a touch damp but not the rallyists enthusiasm as we departed for Goulburn passing through Moss Vale (where the cars, as usual, brought pedestrians to a standstill) and then the

lovely driving roads to Bundanoon, Penrose, Wingello and Tallong. On to a little bit of the new Hume and then off onto quiet roads towards Bungonia, then Goulburn via Gundary.

Arriving at Riversdale, an 1830s coaching inn in the colonial Georgian style that became a family home for almost 100 years, the cars were parked along the spacious driveway. Rallyists were free to wander the house, take tours of the heritage gardens and look at the original outbuildings. Here too we were well catered for by the friendliest National Trust volunteers.

As at Retford Park rallyists emerged from the house and

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garden tours recounting what they discovered about it the history and heritage of the property and the impressive work of the National Trust in preserving this rural treasure.

Wilga and Euan eventually gently encouraged us all to move on to Yass, though some needed little urging as a severe thunderstorm was clearly looming from the Crookwell direction. The drive through rural scenery out to Kippilaw and Merrilla, Cullerin, Dalton, Gunning and Jerrawa was enlivened at times by the lightning and storms to both our left and right, some motorists got a bit of a drenching but many reported later that the rain pretty much missed them. Mindful of the heritage connections of the weekend the route we traversed between Mutmutbilly Road and Cullerin Road near Breadalbane was a short

bit of the Old Sydney Road (to Melbourne), the section travelled through the Cullerin Range to Gunning was the old Hume Highway, a deviation built in 1920s of that Old Sydney Road utilising abandoned formations of the Southern Railway. (And if you looked carefully in this section Old Sydney Road was just beside Cullerin Road, aka the old Hume Highway)

Arriving in Yass rallyists checked in at their motels and most then gathered for a convivial happy hour at Swaggers Motel, yarning among the cars and along the verandas about the day's journey, the historic houses and more. Liquid refreshments were supplied out of Dave Stuart's well known VSCC "Vauxhall Inn", and the motel staff kept up a supply of finger food.

The Tour Dinner was also at Swaggers and more than a hundred sat down to a nice repast and more happy chatter. Speeches from Wilga and special guests Garry Downes, Chair of the Butler Bequest Committee and Clive Lucas, National Trust President confirmed what the entrants had experienced - that heritage cars and heritage properties are indeed a wonderful and synergetic combination.

Hopefully this Tour was a precursor for more collaboration between the National Trust and the veteran and vintage car movement.

For Sunday morning everyone regrouped at Cooma Cottage for a hot breakfast cooked up by the Rotarians. What a treat, I never imagined I'd ever be eating brekky sitting in the sunshine in the forecourt of historic Cooma Cottage. This venerable building was home to Australian-born explorer Hamilton Hume from 1840 to 1873 (Hume as in Hume Highway). He extended an early bungalow built by the pioneering O'Brien family by adding Palladian-style wings, a Greek revival portico, impressive stables outbuildings. It is one of the oldest surviving rural homesteads in the Yass district and southern NSW, and a national treasure acquired by the Trust in 1970.

With no particular haste most of us wandered through Cooma Cottage and then reluctantly bade farewell to other rallyists and made our way home some choosing the quiet return route to Goulburn via Jerrawa, Gunning and the pleasant Cullerin Road.

A Pioneer in Australian Motoring - George Peacock Innes (1863-1936)

Jennifer Fawbert. (Part 1)

"How many Innes cars were there?" When asked this by the Curator of the Australian Motorlife Museum, where the only known surviving Australian Innes car resides, I set about researching the vehicles of Sydney motor dealer George Peacock Innes and quickly it became apparent that though the Innes cars were very interesting Innes himself was arguably more intriguing.

George Peacock Innes was born at Hobart in 1863 and as he recalled he was mechanically minded from his earliest years - "trying to make engines (I) nearly blew my head off when my home-made boiler burst....However, I kept on trying, and at the age of nine I had a crude sort of engine going, all my own make". Innes became an engineer, coming to NSW in 1890 with railway contractors Smith, Finlayson and Timms. In 1893 he married Susan Mills and thereafter resided in Sydney where they raised three children, Myrtle, Elspeth and Donald.

In 1897 Innes, with his brother-in-law Robert Augustus Mills, a successful competition cyclist, opened a cycle works at 84 Bathurst Street, Sydney. They became well known in bicycling circles and were NSW agents for Rudge -Whitworth bicycles employing staff repairing and building new bicycles and George's own inventions - Tasma spray pumps and a collapsible child's cart, which sold well.

Seven Gladiator motor tricycles imported in June 1898 by the English and American Cycle Agency sparked widespread interest, especially when demonstrated by Mademoiselle Serpollete. Innes purchased at least one of the De Dion-engined Gladiators in late 1898 or early 1899 and joined a select group, as The Telegraph in April 1899 reported "With the exception of a few Gladiator motor tricycles, seen occasionally in the streets and which apparently are ridden with a good deal of pleasure and comfort, motor cars are unknown".

The first motor car Innes probably observed was the Thomson Steam Car at the April 1900 Sydney Show where Innes and Mills had a very successful bicycle display. By the 1901 Show the partners advertised they sold De Dionengined tricycles imported from Britain. They had also applied for a patent for a motor and steering attachment to fit to horse drawn vehicles.

In mid-1901 there were about 20 motor vehicles, mostly cycles and motor tricycles, running about the Sydney streets. In July Innes added another when he imported a 5 h.p. Pieper. He recalled that: "When I unpacked it and got the engine going the next trouble was to drive it. After some practice I ventured out with the family aboard, and managed to negotiate the city streets without much difficulty".

In August he shipped the car to Newcastle and drove it to the Singleton Show for exhibition. He said: "*Here I struck trouble. Everyone wanted a ride, the axle broke, and I had to make a new one to drive home*".

Innes was not only one of the few motorists in NSW he was the first fined for speeding. On August 15th 1901 a constable observed him driving in the Domain at about eighteen miles an hour, upon being stopped George indicated he did not know he was going that fast. He was fined 10 shillings.

Innes and Mills began importing 1½ h.p. De Dion-engined Thomas Auto-Bi motor bicycles in December 1901, selling one quickly to W. J. McKinney from Gundagai and another to T.T. Alkin of Yass. In July 1902 Innes ventured up-country on a motor tricycle, arranging agencies with local bicycle shops. One local paper reported - "A stir was caused in the streets of Inverell yesterday by the arrival of a motor - the first one seen here".

Innes and Mills gained more publicity by providing motorised pacing machines for bicycle races. When the Sydney bicycling fraternity permitted a test for motor cycle racing in August 1902 P. Thompson rode an Innes and Mills machine against one built by Isaac Phizackerley and another provided by F. Drury. The success of the test prompted the first motor cycle race run in Sydney in November 1902 at the Cricket Ground, easily won by Robert Mills on an Innes and Mills built machine, third place went to one of their Thomas Auto-Bi's.

During 1902 only three or four established Sydney firms were dealing in motor vehicles, one being Innes and Mills who were then advertising motor cars, motor cycles, motor tricycles and quadricycles as well as bicycles and oil engines.

When Sydney's car owners organized their first motor gathering with a drive to Sandringham and Tom Ugly's Point on September 14th 1902 the run involved Mr. Highland's 4 h.p. Cudell, J. Spencer-Nolan's 4 h.p. Cudell, H. Jones's 5 h.p. Decauville, G. Bradwyn's ex-Innes Pieper, Mr. C Highland's early quadricycle and George Innes with an 8

h.p. Winton car.

Innes visited family in Tasmania in February 1903 taking a Panhard-engined Stirling car with dog cart style body. It attracted considerable interest and Innes offered it for sale there.

Motor cars increasingly engaged George Innes's attention. By December 1903 the firm was advertising shipments of 5 and 6 h.p. cars of the best French make and other unidentified new cars with 5½ and 4½ h.p. engines, as well as new 3 h.p. motor cycles, the Thomas Auto-Bi and new 21/2 h.p. motor cycles built on their premises.

Innes and Mills were cautious in naming the make of cars they were importing, possibly as Bennett and Wood publicised that they had been appointed De Dion Bouton of London's sole and exclusive agents for NSW and Victoria, and they were active in guarding that agency and cautioning buyers against purchasing of De Dion motor vehicles from other vendors.

In January 1904 Innes sold one of the "French" cars to W. B. Wilkinson, a prominent businessman from Stawell, Victoria. Wilkinson had driven to Sydney in a small Covert car, once there he tried one of Innes's recently imported 6 h.p. single cylinder De Dion-engined voiturettes. Wilkinson and his passenger W. A. Whitehead then continued their tour successfully overland back to Stawell in the Innes & Mills car.

The firm's shift to motor cars continued with a car and driver available for hire and motor car parts and accessories for sale. The partnership however ceased with Mills at the end of 1904 and 1905 began with Geo. Innes and Co. of 841/2 Bathurst Street offering a variety of cars from £120 -£300 and importantly the hitherto "unnamed" cars began to be both advertised and reported in the press as Innes cars. That G P Innes engaged in such "badge engineering" is not remarkable for the time, it was a widespread practice.

uncomplicated, possibly some supplied by the French factory from which George directly imported cars - Lacoste et Battmann. Certainly at least one large Innes was landed in December 1905 complete with side entrance bodywork for Mr Ritchie of Ritchie Brothers, engineers and railway carriage builders.

Innes's customers had included several prominent Sydney businessmen but in 1905 perhaps none were more widely known than brothers J. M. and H. R. Arnott. The Arnott's purchased an

Aster-engined 4 cylinder 19-20 h.p. five passenger Innes and a 9 h.p. De Dion-engined two seater Innes and entered their cars in the February 1905 Dunlop Motor Reliability Trial from Sydney to Melbourne.

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

J. M. Arnott took his chauffeur and a good friend, A. B. Paterson. Paterson, then the editor of the Evening News, sent reports back daily, his four special articles were titled "Overland to Melbourne on an Automobile. The History of the Haste Wagons" with illustrations by Lionel Lindsay. Paterson wrote: "When you get a bit of really good road... and the car is at her best, the engine working with a rhythmic hum...while the milestones slip past one after another in surprisingly rapid fashion, and you put the watch on her and find she is doing thirty miles an hour, and only sauntering along at that". The journey in the Innes also resulted in Paterson's wonderful motoring poem The Lay of the Motor Car.


The bigger Innes performed well till the Albury section. Paterson reported: "the car was sent headlong into dust and holes". H. R. Arnott's smaller Innes maintained a cautious pace. Any competitive chance ended for J. M. Arnott when, as Patterson recorded: "near Tarcutta...Bang went some spokes of a wheel... Some flour-mill mechanics at Albury bolted stout timber supports on to either side of the wheel, and with many stoppages we got into Melbourne just before the speeches of welcome were quite finished". Both Innes cars finished the Trial, placing seventh and eighth out of the nine cars that completed in their class.

In November 1905 J. M. Arnott entered the Melbourne to Sydney Reliability Trial. Near Mullengandra the near front wheel of his Innes was




J M Arnott's Innes finishing in Melbourne. Arnott's Innes, showing off side wheel repair

George Innes's optimism also was misplaced as he advertised in the <u>Sydney Morning Herald</u> of Saturday November 18th – "An irresistible force strikes an immovable mass. The big Innes car demolishes a bridge and comes home on three legs. Have a glance at her as she glides silently past. She has lost a few marks, but has beaten many others costing a mint of money. Make a few comparisons, and you'll decide on one of our cars. They cost little, run well, and keep running". Unfortunately spectators did not see the big Innes glide into the Finish at Sydney that day, as the car was taken by wagon to Picton.

bridge, Arnott optimistically repaired it by fitting two crosspieces of timber on each side of the wheel, somewhat akin to the February event repairs and continued on.

Arnott's confidence however was not rewarded. On Saturday November 18th, near the Bargo River crossing the repaired wheel hit a culvert and collapsed. Passenger Lieutenant Cox was thrown out, sustaining ankle and head injuries, Arnott and the chauffeur were uninjured.

1906 started well for Innes and Co. holding the agency for Humber cars. By April 1906 the business name was changed to The Humber Motor Depot and George Innes began championing the British-made car, a habit he became well known for in the motor trade. H. R. Arnott promptly purchased a new Humber - his Innes had a serious accident near Jenolan Caves in April 1905. J. M. Arnott drove an Innes with the ACA group that welcomed Glidden to Sydney in March but then purchased a Swiftsure.



Innes continued to import and sell his French produced Innes cars. Of three new cars landed in April 1906 one with a 12-14 h.p. 4 cylinder Aster engine was for

Les W. Pye. Of the other two Innes' one was to the order of Dr. Farrell of Quirindi, and driven by G.P. Innes and Dr Farrell to Quirindi in one day.

A prominent sportsman and pharmacist Les Pye was credited as being the first Parramatta citizen to own a motor car - a 9 h.p. single cylinder De Dion-engined car bought from Innes in 1904, Pye subsequently owned a twin cylinder De Dion-engined Innes but it was his 1906 Innes that was admired as "the best motor car in the district".



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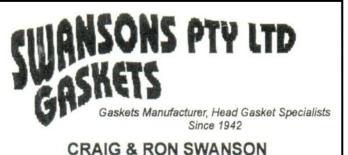
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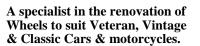
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
