AT THE CRICKET

The Rover hadn't been out since the November Christmas picnic and hadn't been keen to run during the week before the event. I mentioned to Arthur Garthon at the meeting that I was in mortal fear of getting a fuel blockage in the middle of the S.C.G. in front of thirty thousand people. When I arrived at the S.C.G. a little after twelve, he made a wise crack about my having made it after all. That may have been tempting fate, Arthur!

We had a mixed bunch of old cricketers to take around the ground. Sir Donald led in the Rolls and twenty-three other notables, as listed below, followed. I had Alec Bedser, perhaps England's greatest bowler (7/55 and 7/44 at Trent Bridge, 1953). We didn't know whom we would be chauffering so took along my copy of "England Vs Australia" for an autograph. Alec wanted to sit in the front next to me but I suggested a more visible position in the back seat. Really, what a shy man! Rather than sign the fly leaf, he looked for a photo of himself in the book to sign, then, rather than wave to the crowd, he began to read the book. He seemed oblivious of the huge cheering crowd and carried on a conversation with me about the car.

Colin Cowdrey was a couple of T Fords in front. Though dressed in a suit, he picked up a wide-brimmed straw hat and posed in that - always a character, on and off the field.

Well, we're on the field. Hullo, someone's being pushed. It's Arthur's little Rover, carrying Yorkshire's infamous slow-coach opening bat, Geoffrey Boycott. The car must have fallen asleep out of boredom. By the way, I taped the ABC News showing a few cars, including the little Rover being pushed. Any Rover owner may view it free but Ford owners will be charged \$20.

Our neighbours had been telling us that morning that they had been in the NRMA for sixty years. When I saw Arthur being pushed, the thought crossed my mind that it would be just the time to call for Road Service. I imagined the following conversation:

ARTHUR: Hullo, Road Service? My Rover has broken down.

NRMA: Where are you, Sir?

ARTHUR: I'm at the Sydney Cricket Ground.

NRMA: Oh. In Anzac Parade or Moore Park Road?

ARTHUR: Well, actually I'm at Deep Fine Leg in front of the Brewongle Stand. At this point Road Service mutters something about crank callers and hangs up.

Several members took advantage of free tickets. I stayed for a while but the cricket was not very interesting. It had been ten years since I had been to the S.C.G. The dignity of the ground has been replaced by commercialism on a gross scale. Even the white picket fence has gone; now there is wall-to-wall advertising. (Were we the Coca Cola Motorcade?) The nearly completed Sports Ground is stunning but will probably be spoilt with advertising soon.

Well, it would be nice if we could make money for the Club in that way every day. I would have done it for nothing (but don't tell PBL that).



VALE PEGGY HOLMES. BUT MORE SOUVENIR MEMORIES. A BRIEF REPORTAGE
UNDERSTANDABLY, MANY EARLY MEMBERS WILL HAVE NEARLY LOST A RECOLLECTION OF "FIFTY BOB", SANDY HOLMES' 1912 VAUXHALL, WHILE LATER MEMBERS WILL SCARCELY KNOW OF THIS WELL ACCOMPLISHED VEHICLE.

IN JANUARY 1956 SANDY SET OUT AT 3.00AM WITH HIS WIFE PEGGY, TO BREAK THE SPEED RECORD FROM SYDNEY TO MELBOURNE. PEGGY MUST STAND OUT AS ONE OF THE VERY FEW WOMEN, IN FACT THE ONLY WOMAN MEMBER OF THIS CLUB TO THIS DAY, WHO HAS BEEN FLAGGED OUT OF SYDNEY G.P.O. AT SUCH AN UNEARTHLY HOUR... IN AN OPEN, SINGLE SEAT VEHICLE WITH NO HOOD AND MUDGUARDS REMOVED! SOME CLUB MEMBERS MUST BE READING OF THIS EXPLOIT WITH FEELINGS OF ENVY, MOST MEMBERS WITH FEELINGS OF RESPECT FOR A WOMAN WHO HELPED AS NAVIGATOR, IN THIS FORMIDABLE ACCOMPLISHMENT... THE BREAKING OF THAT SPEED RECORD BETWEEN THE TWO CITIES. IF ONE PASSES OUT OF THIS WORLD IN AN ATMOSPHERE OF THE RESPECT OF FELLOW CLUB MEMBERS, WELL THEN, ONES LIFE HAS NOT BEEN IN VAIN.

MEDICAL FACTSPETROL SIPHONING HAZARDS.

Unfortunately, too many people who understand the principle of siphoning i.e. drawing liquid from one container to another on a lower level by sucking it into a tube, usually by mouth and then letting atmospheric pressure do the work- do not appreciate the hazards of utilising the method with Petrol. Clinical studies have shown that petroleum distillates (such as Kerosene, Lighter fluid, Petrol, Naptha) and some solvents are all capable of causing serious consequences if inhaled or ingested.

The greatest danger is not the effect on the stomach, but that in the lungs. When petrol is taken into the mouth, for example a certain amount may enter the lungs, where it spreads out and causes immediate irritation and tissue damage. The destruction of the tissue in turn causes the lungs to fill with fluid-known as pulmonary oedema- and the victim literally drowns in his own fluid! In addition, although the toxicity of petrol is considerably reduced in the stomach, the substance rapidly enters the blood stream and can slow breathing and the heart function. Since these reactions can occur in only a few seconds(the time to take a breath) death, due to a combination of pulmonary oedema and heart failure can result in a matter of minutes. And even then, if the exposure is not fatal, the damaged lungs can incapacitate the victim for a lengthy period. There is another potential hazard to be guarded against- the strong likelihood of more petrol aspirating into the lungs if the victim vomits. This is why products containing light petroleum distillates carry this warning" If swallowed DO NOT induce vomiting".

SIPHONING TIP

All you have to do is feed a length of wire through your plastic hose and tie a peice of sponge rubber on to one end, before you place it into the donor tank. Then, when you pull the wire and sponge upthrough the tube the petrol will follow right behind, siphoning itself out.



He then suggested we should go for someone more youthful and nominated John Gorton - nicest thing anyone has said about 'Gorto' in a long while.



LIFTING CAR WITH TOO HIGH A JACK

Our illustration shows an effective method of raising a car sufficiently high to insert a jack under the axle. If the car is pushed on to the spare wheel, as shown, the axle will be raised three or four inches and a lifting jack which is otherwise too high can be pushed under. Thus an ordinary high-pressure tyre jack can be used to lift a car wheel fitted with balloon tyres.





Club members have approximately 140 Veteran Vehicles operating on a restricted permit system of registration, and many more vehicles under restoration.


